RJD Case Referral Criteria Checklist

When deciding to refer a case to the restorative justice diversion (RJD) program, it must meet ALL of the following criteria:

- □ If RJD did not exist, I would absolutely charge this case
- □ There is an identifiable person harmed
- □ This case is at least one of the following (check all that apply):
 - Burglary
 - □ Assault/Battery
 - Vehicle Theft
 - Grand Theft/Theft of Person
 - □ Theft
 - □ Robbery
 - Arson
 - □ Other serious crime involving an identifiable person harmed
- □ This is *not* a vandalism case
- □ This is *not* a shoplifting case
- □ This is *not* a graffiti case
- □ This is a felony and/or high-level misdemeanor case
